

ALSPACH BROTHERS FINDING SUCCESS IN CAROLINA

CONCORD, N.C. – New Jersey legends car racers Zack and Trevor Alspach have spent the last number of weeks living in North Carolina and racing out of the Kyle Beattie Racing stable. The last week has been their best to date with Zack claiming a semi-pro legends car win Friday night at Caraway (N.C.) Speedway and Trevor garnering his first semi-pro top-five finish of the Quaker Steak & Lube Summer Shootout season with a fine fifth-place run Tuesday at Lowe's Motor Speedway.

“We started on the pole and raced as hard as we could to stay up front,” Trevor said, referring to Tuesday's run. “The car was a little tight, but we were able to stay in the top five. It's our best run of the shootout so far; I think we finished seventh earlier in the season so this is a good result for us.”

For Zack, a win and a fourth-place overall finish in the semi-pro legends car feature Friday night at Caraway gives him momentum heading into the final stretch of the summer. Caraway runs the semi-pro legends car class with the pros, and the three cars finishing ahead of Zack were pro racers, including teammates Christian PaHud (second) and Kyle Beattie (third).

“We started on the pole and ran third for most of the race,” Zack said. “Christian got by me with about five to go and then he went on to pass Kyle, so Beattie Racing cars finished second, third, and fourth overall. We're happy to get the semi-pro win. The car is running better lately and we're hoping for some more good runs before the summers out.”

The Alspach brothers will race at Caraway again Friday before heading to South Boston (Va.) Speedway for a Saturday night INEX legends car regional race.

Zack Alspach, 17, and brother Trevor, 15, are legends car racers from Willingboro, N.J. Former micro-sprint racers, the Alspach brothers have a number of feature victories in legends cars since beginning their tenure in the INEX-sanctioned class in 2007.

The Alspach brothers are members of the Team Full Throttle NASCAR Driver Development Program and are represented by Driver Development Services, Inc., Charlotte, N.C.
