ALSPACH BROTHERS UP TO TEST AGAINST 50 LEGENDS CAR RACERS AT WALL TOWNSHIP TURKEY DERBY

WALL, N.J. – Zack and Trevor Alspach, along with hundreds of other Mid Atlantic racers, made their return to Wall Township Speedway this past weekend for the 35th annual Turkey Derby at the historic Jersey Shore speedway. The weekend marked the reopening of the high-banked one-third mile oval after the track's ownership group announced in March that the facility would be put up for sale for development. Promoters and numerous volunteers worked together over the past weeks to have Wall Stadium ready for its first race in a year.

The INEX legends car class featured 52 entrants for the two-day event, the most of any class in competition. In Friday night's 25 lapper, Zack, 17, drove a masterful race, starting fourth after winning his heat race and driving to second in the feature before the checkered flag waved. Trevor, 15, started 12th in the feature and finished eighth after getting caught up in a midrace jingle that lost him numerous positions that he regained through the rest of the event.

"We had a great race, really just ran out of time," Zack said. "Our car was really good. I had to make a three-wide pass to get up to second, and then we ran down the leader and ended up about a half-second behind him at the end. It was good to come back to Wall and have such a good run against so many cars."

Saturday night featured another 25 lapper for the legends cars. The top 16 from Friday night's feature were inverted for the start of Saturday's race, meaning Zack started 15th and Trevor eighth. Zack was up to fifth at one point in the race before getting involved in an accident that knocked the toe out of his No. 67 legends car. He made a pit stop to repair the car, restarted 20th and made his way back to sixth when he was involved in another accident. He restarted 18th with only a handful of laps remaining and advanced to 10th before the end of the 25-lap affair.

Trevor made his way up to second by the fifth lap of the race and ran there until another car tagged him from behind. The younger Alspach spun out and made contact with the wall, ending his night.

"We were up to second and had a good race going before the guy behind us had brake problems and spun us out into the wall," Trevor explained. "He was pitted right next to us and he came over to apologize and told us about the brake problems he had. It's too bad

because we had a great race. That's the way it goes, though; we'll fix the car and be ready for next season."

For the Alspachs, "next season" will begin in February when the New Jersey-based team travels to Florida for an annual legends car event at Orlando Speedworld.

Zack and Trevor Alspach are legends car racers from Willingboro, N.J. Former micro-sprint racers, the Alspach brothers have a number of feature victories in legends cars since beginning their tenure in the INEX-sanctioned class in 2007.

The Alspach brothers are members of the Team Full Throttle NASCAR Driver Development Program and are represented by Driver Development Services, Inc., Charlotte, N.C. Their marketing partners are Alspach Landscaping, Campanella Landscaping, American Construction & Property Management, and American Solar.
