ZACK ALSPACH CHARGES FROM BACK TO 8TH IN SHOOTOUT OPENER

CONCORD, N.C. – The Alspach Brothers Racing team traveled from their New Jersey home to North Carolina Tuesday for the first of 10 INEX-sanctioned, 600 Racing Quaker Steak and Lube Summer Shootout events at Lowe's Motor Speedway's quarter-mile oval.

Zack Alspach, 17, had to use the B-Main to qualify for the 20-lap Semi-pro Legends car feature while an accident in the same B-Main forced Trevor Alspach, 15, to go off on the hook and not qualify for the night's feature.

In the feature, Zack started 22nd and methodically worked his way to the front of the field. At one point running as high as fourth, a couple late-race restarts shuffled Zack back to eighth, where he finished. The result marked Zack's best-ever finish in a shootout race.

"We're really happy," a smiling Zack Alspach said following Tuesday night's feature. "I feel bad for my brother because he had a pretty rough night, but I'm just really pleased to come out of here with a top-10 finish. The car stayed under me through the whole race and it was just a really good race. These things (shootout races) are so competitive you've got to be happy to take what you can get. Tonight we had enough for eighth and I'm glad we brought it home.

"I also want to thank Charlie Langenstein for his help with the setup. If it wasn't for him, I don't think we would have run as well as we did tonight."

The Alspach brothers plan to make the weekly trip to North Carolina over the next nine weeks to compete in the semi-pro legends car class in the shootout at Lowe's.

Zack and Trevor Alspach are in their second year of racing INEX pavement legends cars after racing quarter-midgets and micro-sprints on the dirt. Currently residing in Willingboro, N.J., both Zack and Trevor are anticipating a move to NASCAR late models, possibly as early as 2009.

The Alspach brothers are members of the Team Full Throttle NASCAR Driver Development Program and are represented by Driver Development Services, Inc., Charlotte, N.C. Their marketing partners are Alspach Landscaping, Campanella Landscaping, American Construction & Property Management, and American Solar.
