TREVOR ALSPACH FOCUSING ON SUMMER SHOOTOUT IN '08

WILLINGBORO, N.J. – Team Full Throttle (TFT) NASCAR Driver Development racer Trevor Alspach plans on taking the INEX Legends car experience he gained throughout 2007 back on the road in 2008. The 14-year-old New Jersey young gun will compete at a variety of racetracks and series this season, most notably the 10-race Summer Shootout Series at Lowe's Motor Speedway's quarter-mile oval in Concord, N.C.

"The shootout is very important," Alspach began. "At Lowe's, we get the opportunity for television time and there are a lot of important people around so you want to do well to try to get recognized. There is more pressure, but I really enjoy going to North Carolina each week in the summer. My brother (Zack, 16, another TFT member) races too, so it's a family trip each week with my parents and it's a lot of fun."

In 2007, Alspach admits he was inexperienced and searching for consistency throughout the season. "We were just starting out and really trying hard to finish up front. The shootout was tough, but I gained a lot of experience racing in it. Later in the season we started to do well racing in Virginia and at Wall Township Speedway (N.J.). We won two races at Wall and that really helped us."

In addition to this season's Summer Shootout Series, Alspach plans to enter his '34 Ford coupe INEX Legends car at speedways throughout the East Coast, including Virginia's South Boston and Shenandoah speedways. Both Trevor and Zack Alspach's opening race for the 2008 season will be March 22 at South Boston Speedway.

Both Alspach brothers expect to be racing a late-model stock car soon. Zack is anticipating a late-model ride later in the 2008 season while TFT has Trevor on track for a possible late-model opportunity sometime in 2009.

Trevor and Zack Alspach are members of the Team Full Throttle Driver Development Program and are represented by Driver Development Services, Charlotte, N.C.
